Open to riders 11 & under. Horses and ponies are eligible. Riders in this division may not compete in classes where prize list class specifications list the fence height above 2'6" in the same show year, with the exception of the CPHA Horsemanship Medal Class. However, someone else may ride the horse and/or pony in other classes. Equitation classes are to be judged on seat hands, legs, control of mount, and suitability. Hunter classes and pleasure classes are to be judged on performance, soundness, and suitability with emphasis on manners. Fences 2'3".

All ponies are required to possess a current USEF Measurement Card or valid measurement form issued by the USEF and it must be shown at the horse show office before numbers are released. Open to ponies ridden by a Junior exhibitor. HORSES OR RIDERS may not cross enter into any Junior Hunter Class. Riders may not cross enter into any division where the fences exceed 3'3" (except Children's Jumpers, Modified Jr-Am Jumpers, Equitation and Medal Classes).

JUMPER DIVISION

In all classes, ties involving first place will be jumped off. In ties not involving first place, times taken in the first round will separate those tied with equal faults.

Jumper Nominating Fee: Horses entered in any Jumper Classes MUST pay a \$50 Jumper Nominating Fee before the closing date of entries in addition to the \$40 entry deposit fee.

Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy: Jumper Nominating Fee refund schedule will be as follows: Before the closing date of entries - 100% - After closing date but before show - 50% - After the show starts - No Refunds

Poling: Manual poling and/or the use of off-sets are prohibited for all horses at this show.

Jumper Tables: Refer to time schedule. Management reserves the right to change tables in all jumper classes with adequate notice to exhibitors.

Martingales: In any jumper class offering less than \$1,000 in prize money, there are no martingale restrictions. In any jumper class offering prize money of \$1,000 to \$4,999; only standing martingales or running martingales used in the conventional manner are permitted. In any class offering prize money of \$5,000 or more (and all classes restricted to young horses); only running martingales used in the conventional manner, are permitted.

Whips: Competitors are prohibited from using a whip that is longer than 30" (75cm) while in the process of jumping or schooling over fences. A rider may not carry more than one whip. Whips that are weighted at the end are prohibited at any time.

Attire: Management will allow competitors to compete without riding coats. If a riding coat is not worn, riders must wear a shirt with a collar or a choker, neatly tucked into riding breeches. A windbreaker or raincoat may be worn if conditions require.

45 Second Clock: A competitor will have 45 seconds from the time the judge sounds an audible signal to cross between the start markers in the proper direction and start on course. If the competitor does not cross through the start line within the allotted time, the time on course will start when the 45 seconds expires.

Orders of Go: Will be computer generated and rotated by the Starter.

Jumper Changes: Changes must be made within 30 minutes after the last class of the corresponding ring the day preceding the change to insure that the entry will be accepted and to avoid being charged a post entry penalty. Changes made after this time may not be accepted and will be charged the post entry penalty.

Time Allowed: For all jumper classes not offering \$25,000 or more in prize money, the time allowed will be measured at 382 yards/minute (350 meters/minute). The time allowed will be adjusted accordingly.

Arena Size & Footing:

Grass Field – 300' x 500' with grass footing.

Indoor Arena – 150' x 300' with sand footing.

Abuse -Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or additional penalties. Excessive abuse includes use of the whip four times or more.

This class is open to Child and Adult riders who have never won any PCHA, USEF, National or local medal class, equitation, hunter, or jumper class with fences 3' or higher. Riders may not compete if they have won any association medal finals where fences are 3'. Trainers and riders must be members of the CPHA prior to riding in this class. Fences 2'6" in height with no combinations and at least two changes of direction. No work-off and one test of either a halt or trot fence as part of the original course. There must be three entries to fill the class and three to complete the course. For additional specifications, check www.cpha.org.

341. C.P.H.A. CHILD/ADULT MEDAL

This class is open to Child and Adult riders who have **never** won any PCHA, USEF, National, Local or Regional medal class, equitation, hunter, or jumper class with fences 3'3" or higher. Riders may not compete if they have **won any association** medal finals with fences 3'3" or higher. Trainers and riders must be members of the CPHA prior to riding in this class. Fences 3' in height with at least two changes of direction. At least two riders must work off using USEF tests 1-8. Three points qualifies for the finals. There must be three entries to fill the class and three to complete the course. Points are awarded as follows: Five or more riders – 6,4,3,2,1; Four riders – 4,3,2,1; Three riders – 3,2,1. 342. U.S.E.F. PONY EQUITATION CLASS

17 & Under – Fence heights are applicable to the height of the pony. **Six (6) riders must complete the course.** Two tests (1-9) are required during the first round. Must be a member of USEF. For additional specifications, check www.usef.org.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

2009 L.A.E.C. Opener Horse Show and 2009 L.A.E.C. Winter Horse Show – Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above, and Combined Driving competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining, and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides provided the respective breed/discipline dues or breed/discipline category fee has been paid. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions, and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$20 non-member registration fee and a \$5 breed/discipline category fee for each breed/discipline. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; and 4) classes for 4-H Members; 5) walk-trot and academy classes (classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and Quadrille classes; 7) NRHA endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, or current membership in good standing of their own National Federation; 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in dressage sport horse breeding classes.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Langer Equestrian Group Inc. and the Los Angeles Equestrian Center harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted unless the entry blank is signed by a parent or guardian. The signature of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be acceptable.

MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; change rings or rotate judges; change specifications in jumper classes in order to facilitate the time schedule. Once divisions and/or classes have been combined, they will not be uncombined unless, on the morning of the first class, there are 8 entries in each division and/or class.

ENTRY PROCEDURES:

- a. For each horse entered, send only a \$40 Entry Deposit Fee, the appropriate Jumper Nominating Fee, the Hunter/Equitation Fee, plus a fee of \$150 for each stall requested. Stall requests received after the closing date of entries will be \$175.
- b. Send with your completely filled out entry blank on or before the closing date of entries. The entry form **MUST** include: Name of horse and a complete description, name of owner and address, name of trainer, and classes or divisions you intend to compete in (for scheduling purposes). Incomplete entries will be considered and treated as late entries.
- c. Bring a check for the remainder of your fees to the show. A signed open check may be left for classes that are added during the show.
- d. If entry blanks are postmarked on or before the closing date of entries and are properly filled out the Entry Deposit Fee will be credited to the entries due.

LATE ENTRIES AND/OR INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL FORFEIT THE ENTRY DEPOSIT FEE!!

- e. **DO NOT** make entries from the time schedule. Consult the index to classes. Time schedules are subject to change after the close of entries. Therefore, upon arrival at the show, be sure to check the time schedule in the Show Office.
- f. All horses entered in any hunter and/or equitation classes **MUST** pay a \$40 Hunter/Equitation Fee. All horses entered in any jumper class must pay a \$50 Jumper Nominating Fee.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: Any horse on the grounds that is not showing in the horse show will pay a \$50 'Non-Showing' Fee.

ENTRIES CLOSE: L.A.E.C. OPENER – FRIDAY, JANUARY 2ND
L.A.E.C. WINTER – FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 27TH

ADDS & SCRATCHES: Horses will be allowed to add classes the day before the class at no extra charge and they will receive full credit for scratched classes, providing they are scratched the day before. If post entries are accepted on the day of, the post entry penalty will be \$10 per class. If classes are scratched the day of, they will receive full credit less a \$10 per class scratch fee. Horses and/or riders who go in a class without entering will be charged \$25 extra.

SUBSTITUTIONS: With a vet certificate, a new horse may be substituted for a scratched horse. There will be a \$40 office charge.

SHOW SCRATCH REFUNDS:

Horses that are scratched before the closing date of entries will receive a full refund of all fees paid for that horse's account. Horses that are scratched after the closing date of entries but before the entry number is picked up will receive a full refund of any fees paid for that horse's account with the exception of the stall fee and entry deposit fee. After the show starts, with official show vet certificate only, full refunds will be given minus a \$40 per horse scratch fee, stall fees, and fees for classes already held prior to notification, whether exhibited in or not. If a division entry fee is pro-rated for a vet slip refund, the individual classes entered will be surcharged \$10 for each class in which the horse competed in, in addition to the \$40 scratch fee.

ADD BACK MONEY: In classes with add back, prize money is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses that are entered but do not show up forfeit their add back.

PRIZES: All class winners will receive a trophy and ribbons through 8th place in addition to any prize money. Prize money will pay to 5th place; 30%, 25%, 20%, 15%, 10%. Except Special Classes - see specifications. Prize money checks will be made to the owner listed on the entry and will be mailed within 30 days after the show. **NO PRIZE MONEY WILL BE MAILED UNLESS THE SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OF THE OWNER IS LISTED ON THE ENTRY BLANK.**

STABLING: Stalls, whether occupied by horses, feed, or tack, will be available for \$150 each. *Stalls received after the closing date of entries will be \$175 each.* First bedding will NOT be included. Permanent stalls are 10' x 10' wood construction with doors.

TRAILER INS: There will be a \$50 per day grounds fee for horses that trailer in.

FEED AND BEDDING: Hay, grain and bedding will be available at the Horse Show. Prior arrangements can be made with US Horse Feed & Shavings. The phone number is 818.559.9699.

RV PARKING: RV Hookups will be available at a rate of \$150 for the duration of the show. All RV's must be self-contained.

RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure. All returned checks will be charged an additional 10% penalty (minimum \$25). Accounts will be given ten days to be paid in full or they will be turned into US Equestrian and Pacific Coast Horse Shows Assn. for further disciplinary action.

CLOSED RINGS: Horses are not permitted in arenas when a course is set or in the process of being set for an upcoming class.

SCHOOLING RULES: Schooling will be permitted in designated areas only. The word schooling includes but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading, and exercising. **In accordance with California State Law, poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted.** Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for fines and/or elimination. Hunter rings will be open the day prior to the start of the show and at management's discretion, for a limited amount of time at the beginning and at the conclusion of the show day.

SCHOOLING SUPERVISION: Please be advised that starters are part of the schooling supervisor staff and as such have authority to enforce USEF schooling rules. Violations in the schooling ring should immediately be brought to the attention of the starter of the corresponding ring.

COURSES: Courses may consist of any combination of the following; Brush, Gate, Oxers, Post and Rails, Water, Liverpools, Ditch, Walls, Panels, Banks and Coops. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to adjust fence heights or spreads in Jumper classes as competition warrants.

CONFLICTS: It is the intention of management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Starters have the authority from management to scratch riders who are not timely.

ABUSE: Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and may be subject to fines and/or penalties. Excessive abuse includes, but is not limited to, use of the whip four or more times and/or use of the whip in front of the horses shoulder.

DESIGNATED PARKING: All trucks, autos, golf carts, and other motorized vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. To insure the safety of all exhibitors, only persons with a valid driver's license may operate any motorized vehicles (electric or gasoline).

MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the rules of USEF Bio-Hazardous Medical Waste containers are provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

ARENAS: All warm up and competitions arenas contain sand footing. Dimensions are as follows: Equidome – 150 x 300; Large Oval – 150 x 300; East Ring – 135 x 285; Allen Arena – 150 x 300.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, all riders in Hunter, Jumper, and Hunter Seat Equitation classes where jumping is required, and all riders when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear that meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured. Additionally, the above headgear requirements are mandatory for juniors and strongly encouraged for adults while riding on the flat anywhere on the competition grounds.
